Before You Begin:

- Read and understand the manufacturer's installation instructions for the specific mosaic tile you are using. These instructions may differ from the general recommendations provided here.
- **Inspect the tiles** for any cracks, chips, or other imperfections before installation. Damaged tiles should be replaced.
- Gather the necessary tools and materials. This may include a notched trowel, tile adhesive appropriate for natural stone, grout suitable for the type of stone, tile spacers, grout float, utility knife, sponges, buckets, safety glasses, respirators, and knee pads.
- Ensure your work area is clean, dry, and free of debris.
- Acclimatize the tiles to the room temperature for at least 24 hours before installation.

Surface Preparation:

Thinset Mortar Application:

- **2. Spread the thinset mortar** onto the prepared surface using a notched trowel. The trowel notch size should be appropriate for the size of your mosaic tiles.
- **3. Apply a thin, even layer** of thinset mortar to an area slightly larger than the mosaic sheet you will be installing.

Mosaic Tile Installation:

- 1. Carefully place the mosaic sheet onto the thinset mortar bed, starting from one corner and working your way outwards.

- **3.** Use a tapping block (a small piece of wood or rubber) to gently tap the mosaic sheet to ensure even placement.
- 4. Maintain a consistent grout joint width between mosaic sheets using tile spacers.

5. Continue laying mosaic sheets in this manner, working your way across the installation area.

Cutting Mosaic Tiles (if necessary):

- Use a **wet saw** equipped with a diamond blade specifically designed for cutting natural stone.
- Wear safety glasses and a respirator when cutting mosaic tiles.
- Score and snap the mosaic sheet along the desired cutting line for small adjustments.

Grouting:

- 1. Allow the thinset mortar to cure completely according to the manufacturer's instructions before grouting.
- 2. Mix the grout according to the manufacturer's recommendations.
- **3. Apply the grout** diagonally across the mosaic sheet using a grout float, filling the joints completely.
- **4. Remove excess grout** from the tile surface with a damp sponge, working diagonally across the tiles. Rinse the sponge frequently.
- **5. Buff the tile surface** with a clean, dry cloth to remove any grout haze.

Sealing:

- Natural stone mosaics may require sealing to protect them from stains and moisture.
- **Consult the manufacturer's recommendations** for the specific type of stone and choose a sealant suitable for natural stone applications.
- **Apply the sealant** after the grout has completely cured, following the manufacturer's instructions.

Cleaning:
